Trash Collection Reminders

RCS will collect all properly prepared yard waste on your regular trash service day. Yard waste should be placed at the curb - not in the road - by 7:00 a.m. Limbs and brush should be separate from other waste and not more than 5' in length nor over 6" in diameter. Never place more than one (1) pile of limbs or brush, approximately 4' high by 4' wide and 5' in length, at the curb each week. Grass clippings and leaves must be bagged (10 bag limit). **DO NOT BLOW LEAVES OR DEBRIS INTO THE ROAD.** If yard debris exceeds these specifications, no service will be provided. **No building materials, wood blocks, tree stumps, trunks or logs will be picked up.** Thank you for your cooperation.

Holiday Garbage Schedule

Thursday households will receive trash and recycling services one day delayed.

Thanksgiving Day - Thursday, November 26

Note: Yard debris pickup will vary during the week of a holiday. Please have your yard debris to the curb by 7:00 am on Monday. No yard debris pick up December 29 - January 2.

Keeping Your Family and Home Safe

DOORS: Since most intruders enter a residence by physically compromising a door or frame, strong doors and frames are essential to your security. Lock your doors at all times, even if you are at home.

WINDOWS: Don't make it easy for a burglar by leaving your windows unlocked. Locks that come with the windows are not effective. Purchase a sturdy lock and keep it locked.

GARAGE DOORS: Keep it closed and locked. This helps protect valuable property stored in your garage and prevents access to interior doors in the house. An open garage is an invitation for a burglar.

STORAGE SHEDS: Storage sheds or outside buildings should be securely locked. Any tools or equipment, which could help a burglar break into your house, should be locked in the shed or locked in the garage.

CARS: Do not leave your valuables in your car. Lock your car at all times.
